Play a word or guessing game like "I Spy" or "Scrabble"	Prepare a meal together. Read the ingredient lists and cooking instructions.	Write a letter or email together and send it.	Read a magazine or comic book together.	Share a family story from when a parent or grandparent was a child.
Listen to the radio or a favorite CD together	Do a jigsaw puzzle together	Look at family photo albums together – talk about your favorite pictures.	Make a list or a collage of your favorite things (color, season, food etc.) together.	See how many words you can think of using the letters in Family Literacy Bingo!
Draw, color or paint a picture – experiment with using dots and lines, black and white or lots of colors.	Have a "no screens" evening – no tv or computer time for anyone. Cozy up with candles and a favorite book	Play a board game or card game together. Think about having a "games night" once a month.	Fix, build or create something together. For example, sew on a button, or frame or hang a picture.	Act out a rhyme, a song, or a play together. Don't forget to make tickets for the show!
